The reasons for my/our submission are:

I recognise that urban sprawl can not continue, unchecked, particularly on rich agricultural land. Equally, housing intensification needs to be planned, so that inhabitants all have access to sunlight and green space. If housing intensification occurs, it should occur within a larger planning framework, where access to sunlight and green space have priority, rather than infilling existing sections in an ad hoc manner, taking away pre-existing properties' sunlight. Planning for housing intensification should also take account of inevitable carparking needs, and the spillover of this onto urban streets. Safe walk and cycle ways need to be planned for, with the inevitable increase in traffic. All planning in Lincoln should be consistent with its Envirotown status, and foster community.
